In 2005, Mary Petro made arrangements for her estate to assist individuals living in Sun City Center with essential needs such as food and medicine.

Fund Overview

The Mary Petro Food and Medicine Fund is managed by the South Shore Council of Community Foundation of Tampa Bay and administered by the United Methodist Church of Sun City Center. For over thirteen years, this fund has been dedicated to supporting residents of Sun City Center and Kings Point.

Our Mission

Our mission is to offer temporary assistance to residents facing urgent needs for food and/or medicine.

Eligibility Criteria

- Individuals earning \$25,000 or less per year, or couples with an income of \$30,000 or less, are eligible.
- Applicants must be permanent residents of Sun City Center or Kings Point.
- Applications are assessed annually, and all information is kept confidential.

Pastor's Corner – Travis Taylor

Paul's and Timothy's Relational Discipleship in the Body of Christ

It has often been said that Christianity isn't a *religion* as much as it is a *relationship*. While I have mixed feelings about such a statement, I can certainly see the point trying to be made. The idea that Christianity is more about our relationship with Jesus than it is about following a long list of dos and don'ts. Like marriage... while there are certainly rules to be followed if the marriage is to survive, the quality of the marriage really hinges on the caliber of the relationship. On the willingness of the couple to be honest, intimate, and vulnerable with each other... to teach and to be taught.

In the same vein, the Church is also called to a certain level of intimacy and vulnerability in its relationships. The apostle Paul tells the church in Ephesus, "...you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord." -Ephesians 2:19-21

Like a large family with fathers and mothers, patriarchs and matriarchs, the Church, rooted in Christ, is joined together by faith and submission. A willingness to teach and be taught. The apostle Paul thought of Timothy as his own son. He shared his heart with Timothy, taught, and trained him up in the ways of the Lord by the power of the gospel, and Timothy *let* him.

The Church needs fathers and mothers who joyfully pour themselves sacrificially into relationships to keep their family strong!

This month, I'd like to challenge us all to consider: "Who's my Paul?" And "Who's my Timothy?" "Who am I listening to and learning from?" And "Who am I spending time with and pouring into?"

Such mentorship is essential if we are to grow strong leaders and equip the next generation of the Church.





On September 19th, we will once again have Billy "Elvis' Lindsey performing for an Alzheimer's Benefit concert. Billy has been graciously presenting a concert at a very reasonable cost to allow for most of the proceeds to go to this much needed cause. Lindsey has been giving "Elvis" tribute concerts for years and is the winner of numerous awards for his "ELVIS" act. Lindsey has performed in many venues, including cruise ships, and has travelled extensively with his act. He is the past winner of "The ELVIS Extravaganza" Contest at the Florida State Fair, Best Look-A-Like, and Fan Favorite. If you love that great music from the past or have ever been a fan of Elvis and his music, you won't want to miss this great concert!

On September 21st, we will be presenting another recital in the Rasmussen Artist Series. This recital will feature our own Teodora Mitze-Cîrciumaru and Brent Douglas. They will be doing an organ/piano and four-hand/four-feet organ program that is exceptional!! As an opera pianist and vocal coach, he has formed partnerships with acclaimed organizations including St. Petersburg Opera, Opera Tampa, the Springfield Regional Opera in Missouri, and the Savannah Voice Festival in Georgia.

On September 26th, America's Funniest Comedy Magician, Dewayne Hill will be here to dazzle the audience with a night of comedy and magic. Voted America's No.1 Funniest Comedy Magician, Dewayne Hill has been performing magic for over 20 years. Born in Brooklyn, NY and growing up in Charleston, WV, Dewayne got interested in magic from a substitute teacher that did a card trick. After six months of practicing, he started performing in his community and had his first official gig at a church. This caught the attention of a local TV producer. Dewayne's TV appearance landed him a frontpage newspaper article. That ignited a flood of performances that would eventually lead to paying and funding Dewayne's college. In 2020, while the world was shut down because of COVID, Dewayne expanded his reach to acting coaches and screenwriters to develop a screenplay called "The Discernment". In 2021 the project was funded and filming was underway. The film has since won several awards and was selected in 11 different film festivals all over the world and will be airing on several streaming platforms this year. In 2007, Dewayne set a world record by performing the most card tricks in 60 minutes. We will have both adult and youth tickets for this event.

It seems like I was just getting ready for the Community Back-to-School event at the end of July, and the next thing I knew we were in August...and now here we are already in September. Where did the time go?

As you probably noticed, I did not write an article for the August newsletter as I was enjoying time away with family in Seattle. So, this month, I wanted to share a few highlights from our 3rd Annual Community Back-to-School event. And what an event it was! We had parents and students lined up at 7:30AM ready to get through our doors - our event did not start until 10:00AM! What an incredible turnout we had this year!

This year we had over 1200 people on our church campus for this wonderful event that you and our community participated in. Because of your donations - monetary, school supplies and the donation of your time - is how we were able to pull off another successful event. I am pleased to share with you that we, as a community, served over 600 students this year with supplies, school physicals offered by BayCare Kids, eye examinations by Preserve Vision, dental exams and fluoride treatments by Mission Smiles. Over thirty-five students received physicals, over seventeen of those students received vaccines, and eighty-four students received eye exams. Mission Smiles stayed quite busy with completing over 300 dental checks and one hundred ninety-nine fluoride treatments!

In addition to school supplies, medical exams and screenings, students received books from Kiwanis, and Feeding Tampa Bay provided fresh produce for families. A Big Thank You to our community volunteers from BayCare, HCA SouthShore Hospital, Gannon University, Kings Point Pickleball Club, The Rotary Club of Sun City Center, the Lions Club, Edward Jones, St Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Calvary Lutheran Church, The Beth Israel Jewish Congregation, Nearly New and so many others. And thank you to *you*,

our wonderful congregation, who always answer the call. Without your support and all of our volunteers, this annual event could not happen, so thank you for your continued support.

As we enter into this new month, here are a few highlights of things on the horizon:

We are beginning work on our "Bare Necessities for All" Ministry project to support our underserved and vulnerable populations, such as low-income seniors, veterans and school-age children and youth by providing healthy food, clothing, and hygiene products. Funds are being used to provide basic day-to-day necessities to individuals and families who have challenges navigating everyday life in the local area of Apollo Beach, Gibsonton, Riverview, Ruskin, Sun City Center, and Wimauma. Stay tuned to see how our church continues affecting lives in our local community.

Join us for Movie Night on September 12th at 6:00pm in the Life Enrichment Center (L.E.C.) when we will be showing "Lost on a Mountain in Maine", a true story of a young boy's survival in the wilderness after becoming trapped on a treacherous mountain with a fast-moving storm approaching. Come join us for a great movie. Refreshments are provided for a donation to support this wonderful community event.

On Saturday, September 27th, we will host a health clinic with BayCare Community Health from 10:00AM until 2:00PM in the LEC Lobby. Screenings will include A1C, Glucose, and Blood Pressure screenings in addition to Body Mass Index (BMI) screenings. We are hopeful that we will be able to offer FLU vaccines at the same time, stay tuned on that. This event is open to the community, so come and get screened and bring a friend along.

Thank you for your help and volunteer work you do to help through our different ministries and missions. **WE** could not do what we do in our community and abroad without your help and financial support. Thank you for answering God's call to love each other fully.
