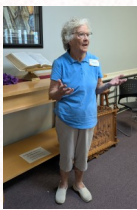

Wars and Rumors of Wars

I fell in love with Irish music in the spring of 1995. It was the year I graduated high school, and I distinctly remember standing at a Blockbuster Music counter (a music store that let you listen to music before buying it) and listening to The Chieftains' new album, *The Long Black Veil*. I stood at the counter for over an hour, listening to vocalists like Mark Knopfler, Mick Jagger, Van Morrison, and Sting croon Gaelic over tin whistles and frame drums and feeling completely transported.

While many Irish songs paint pictures of bygone eras, tragic love stories, and simpler days, a recurring theme of the last Century has been linked to the Easter Rising of 1916 that occurred near the end of WWI, when the Irish Republican Army rose up against British colonialism. Over 30-million people perished in WWI and the Easter Rising of 1916 would serve as the catalyst for a decades-long rebellion in which thousands more would die in the violence of revolution.

One of the saddest songs about the Great War and the Troubles was written in 1976 by Eric Bogle, titled, *The Green Fields of France*. The song portrays a weary traveler resting beside the grave of a young Irish boy, named Willie McBride, who died in 1916 at the age of nineteen. The song is mournful and reflective as the traveler wonders about Willie and asks him if he thinks his sacrifice was worth it.

“Young Willie McBride, I can't help but wonder why
Do those who lie here know why did they die?
And did they believe when they answered the call
Did they really believe that this war would end wars?”

For the sorrow, the suffering, the glory, the shame
The killing and dying, were all done in vain
For young Willie McBride, it all happened again
And again, and again, and again, and again...”

In His Olivette discourse, Jesus tells us, “Many will come in My Name, claiming to be the Messiah and will deceive many.” He says, “...nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and “there will be famines and wars and rumors of wars.” And then He says that “these things must take place and that they are the beginning of labor pains.” – Matthew 24:4-8

Wars are nothing new, but they always take a toll. War is hell; innocent people die... and for what? As our country once again stands on the precipice of armed conflict, let us not be deceived by the allure of violence. Instead, let us prayerfully consider the words of Jesus, consider who we are truly following into battle, and if the victory we hope for is really worth the cost we'll pay for it.

Thank you all so much for sharing your talents with us and helping bring our Holy Week to life!



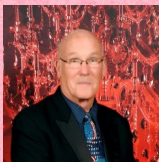

We did it! On Sunday, April 19 we announced that we had exceeded our goal of raising \$1M to pay off our mortgage. **To date, we have raised \$1,255,000 in pledges!** What an amazing sign of enthusiasm and hope for our church's future. As we shared from the beginning, any overage toward the campaign goal will be used to start a Future Building Improvement Fund that will help with maintenance and upkeep on our wonderful church facilities. Healing from loss is a journey: *Everyone experiences grief differently.*

A new Grief Share session will begin on Wednesday, May 6th, from 6:30 PM – 8:00 PM in Room 19. This 13-week grief support group will be led by Pastor Debbie Marion, Minister of Pastoral Care, and focuses on important grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. Weekly videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by our group discussion where confidentiality is key to the success of this program.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing while friends or family members have returned to their daily routines. Too often people tend to repress their grief and allow fear of what others may think keeping them from what could be helping them. Your bereavement experience may be recent, or not so recent. The hope is that you will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, sibling, other family members, or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in your grief and that you do not need to stay there. You will learn valuable information about dealing with the changes in your life and renewing your hope for the future.

Anchor House Missions Workday

On March 26, 13 volunteers from SCCUMC travelled to SeaPort Manatee in Palmetto, FL to do some spring cleaning at the Anchor House facility. Our work included painting, cleaning up the parking area, washing windows, dusting, cleaning the kitchen, bathrooms and furniture and writing encouraging notes to seafarers. We helped to ensure the Anchor House facility is a welcoming space for port workers to spend their break, grab some lunch, watch TV, play pool or just relax. Anchor House staff also make ditty bags for the seafarers they meet. Our congregation provided 44 hats (from Knit-A-Square), 3 bins of lotion, shampoo and body wash (Ladies' Brunch) and 4 bags of work gloves, electrolyte powders and USB-C power cords (Men's Breakfast) for these ditty bags! We took a tour of Port Manatee and were able to chat with the ship's Captain and First Officer of the Blue Star. The Anchor House team tries to visit each ship in port to talk to the crews, provide portable Wi-Fi connections (so they can contact their families back home), share the gospel and even hold Bible studies, if the captain and crew are interested. They also provide a van service to drive seafarers who have shore passes to the mall, the movies or out to eat. The Anchor House staff and volunteers are planting seeds of faith as they share the gospel with international seafarers who may only be in port for 48 hours or less. But those seeds travel with them while they pick up and drop off cargo around the world. We pray those seeds will be watered and fertilized along the way by other believers they meet and, eventually, lead to changed lives as these seafarers come to understand Jesus' saving grace for them personally.

Thank God It's Variety (T.G.I.V.) - Larry Hirchak

As May arrives, the temperatures are rising and most of the "snowbirds" have already returned to their northern habitats. This time of the year is when the concert series slows down a bit and we begin our Sunday afternoon recital series which lasts through October. For the month of May, we only have two events scheduled.

The first one is on Friday, May 22, 2026 at 7:00PM when the Cypress Creek Jazz Band will be returning to present a benefit concert for the Sun City Center Security Patrol titled "*Keep Calm, Keep Jazzy With the Cypress Creek Jazz Band*". They were here last December and performed "*All That Christmas Jazz*" with rave reviews. The Cypress Creek Jazz band is a group of local musicians with strong roots in the Tampa music scene. They perform a New Orleans's style jazz, joyful Dixieland jazz, Spiritual Dixieland Hymns and Old-time gospel. They have performed together for over 7 years all over the Tampa area at venues like the Straz Center, Carrollwood Cultural Center, Dade City Kumquat Festival as well as many others. They also have played at corporate events, festivals, weddings, Madri Gras events, and community events. But what keeps this group together is their love for the early jazz music of New Orleans Dixieland. "Arguably the happiest of all music is Dixieland jazz. The sound of several horns improvising together on fairly simple chord changes with definite roles for each instrument but a large amount of freedom, cannot help but sound consistently joyful." – Scott Yanow

Then on Sunday, May 24, 2026 at 3:00PM, organist Tom Ingui will be presenting an organ recital as part of the Rasmussen Artist Series. Tom Ingui serves as Organist at the First Presbyterian Church of Lakeland, Florida and is a collaborative artist with Southeastern University and the Bach Festival of Central Florida. He also serves as the Dean of the Tampa AGO (American Guild of Organists) Chapter. He holds a Master of Music degree in organ performance from Yale University, studying with Thomas Murray, and a Bachelor of Music degree from Stetson University where he studied organ with Dr. Boyd Jones and piano with Dr. Michael Rickman. He was a finalist in the 2015 Taylor National Organ Competition and placed third at the 2025 St. Maurice International Organ Competition in Switzerland. Recently, he was invited to compete in the Boston Bach International Organ Competition this September. Come for an afternoon of music (from famous symphonies) arranged for organ. A free will offering will be taken up for this recital.

Finally, as this will be my last month here as your Concert Coordinator, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to the staff and to all of you for the magnificent support and friendships that I have made during my tenure in this role. These past three years have been some of the most enjoyable and memorable years of my life. Getting to know so many people and artists has truly been a blessing to me! As Gwen and I anxiously make our move to Italy, leaving such a wonderful church family will certainly be bittersweet.

Please welcome and support my replacement, Steve Krogh, as he takes on this role and takes the program into the future.

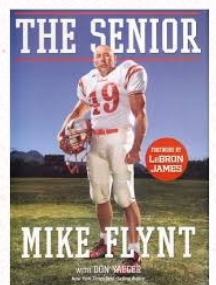
