Watoto



Watoto is a community of villages in Uganda that raises children to young adults, giving them love and support throughout their growing years in faith and vocation. In the Watoto villages, homes are all identical in that they have three bedrooms (one for boys, one for girls, and one for the mother) a living room, a dining room, a kitchen, and a bathroom. All the homes have a full-time mother who cares for the children as if they were her own. The mother of each home prepares meals for her children and the children are given chores and duties to share the responsibilities of each home. The children's villages also have a primary and high school on-site. Once the children begin attending university they shift to apartments or hostels near the school they are attending. The homes are arranged in clusters or circles of nine homes to mimic a typical African community. The center space inside the circle becomes a common space for children in those homes to congregate, interact, and play.

Since SCCUMC has been sponsoring children since 2011, many of the children are now older. Watoto's support for the children continues through university or vocational training. Watoto is grateful for the faithful support that has allowed them to continue caring for these children to the point that some have even graduated from the program and transitioned to independent living. Let's meet our sponsored housemother, youth, and young adults.

Housemother, "Mama" Martha Akello

Martha attended the Watoto Church – Suubi, when she lived in a nearby community. At church she learned about Watoto Child Care Ministries and their vision to rescue needy children. Filled with a desire to serve God, she felt led to apply to be a housemother. After careful screening and training, Martha was accepted and moved into the comfortable Watoto Village. Martha is giving leadership to a family of pre-Watoto children in her Watoto Home. Martha loves children so much and desires to give care to these dear ones who have lost their own parents. She lovingly guides and nurtures the children spiritually and physically. In the Watoto Home, she ensures that they are always well fed and neatly

dressed. Martha sends the children off to school each weekday with a prayer.

On Sundays, Martha accompanies the children to the Watoto Church where they receive spiritual guidance and nourishment. Martha took Jesus into her heart as Friend and Saviour in 2011. Please pray for her to daily receive godly guidance as she continues her ministry.

Francis Junior Onyango: Aug. 4, 2009



Francis's mother died in 2009. Two years later, his father passed away too, leaving Francis and his siblings in the care of a relative who found that she just could not cope with the extra responsibilities. The local authorities learned about the children's plight and requested Watoto Child Care Ministries to take Francis and his siblings into their fold. They were brought to a welcoming Watoto Village. Francis now enjoys the comfort of his new Watoto Home. His devoted housemother, Mama Martha,

lovingly nurtures him and prepares him delicious meals. He is surrounded by Watoto brothers and sisters who watch out for him and are now his cherished companions. Now Francis is old enough and is receiving a quality education at the Watoto School.

Ishmael Baributs: Mar. 15, 2002



Both of Ishmael's parents died as a result of HIV/AIDS. Ishmael was left in the care of his elderly grandmother who could not adequately provide for even his basic needs. She requested Watoto Child Care Ministries to take Ishmael under their wings and Ishmael was brought to a Watoto Village, where Mama Martha welcomed him. He has caring Watoto brothers and sisters in the Watoto Home, who have helped him fit into his new surroundings. He is a great help to Mama around the house. Ishmael

is receiving quality education at the Watoto School and is enjoying his studies and making new friends. Ishmael likes to go to the Watoto Church with his family on Sundays and is being taught from the Word of God. Please pray for Ishmael to respond positively to this spiritual mentorship. He is grateful to the Lord for his many blessings at Watoto.

Maimuna Nakibuuka: Mar. 24, 2003



Maimuna lost both her parents and was left in the care of her grandmother. Unfortunately, she was in no proper position to meet her granddaughter's needs as desired. Concerned local authorities reached out to Watoto and referred Maimuna to our care and protection. Since then, Maimuna has lived in our welcoming Watoto Village where she has a devoted Watoto mother, Mama Martha, and Watoto siblings to share life with. Maimuna graduated from Watoto High School and enrolled at one of the

best vocational schools in the country and is doing a course in Tourism Operation and Management. Being very extroverted, Maimuna enjoys the field trips and internships done in the course because through these she has met many people and visited many parts of Uganda. Maimuna is thankful to God for Watoto Church where she has grown in the Lord through the weekly church services, discipleship programs, and small group fellowships. Along with her peers, she shares and learns from the Word of God.

Sydney Tumwebaze Female: Jul. 28, 2008



Baby Sydney was born prematurely at a hospital in Kampala. Two weeks later, her mother abandoned her. Her impoverished father was unable to look after the infant and local authorities asked Watoto Child Care Ministries to take the baby girl under their wings. Sydney was malnourished when she arrived at the Baby Watoto-Bulrushes Home and had difficulty in eating. With proper care and attention from her nannies, Sydney thrived. She learned to walk and loved playing in the baby swimming pool. In due time,

Sydney was moved into a comfortable Watoto Village where a loving housemother, Mama Martha, and Watoto brothers and sisters welcomed her warmly into their Watoto Home. Sydney is a happy, lively, and bright girl who enjoys the company of others. Sydney has begun a quality education at the Watoto School where she will study until she graduates from high school. On Sundays, Sydney goes to the Watoto Church with her family, where she is learning about Jesus' love for her. Please pray for Sydney to accept Christ into her heart when she reaches the age of understanding.

Paige Natukunda: Aug. 5, 2008



Paige, was born prematurely at a Kampala hospital and was abandoned soon after birth. Local authorities requested Watoto Child Care Ministries to take the baby girl into their fold. As Paige lay in her cot battling a fragile heart condition, staff at the Baby Watoto-Bulrushes Home lavished her with love and attention. Soon her heart was miraculously healed and Paige became much stronger.

Although she was smaller than most other babies in the nursery, Paige always went out of her way to play with her new friends. She loved being cuddled and going on outings with her nannies. In due time, Paige was moved into a safe Watoto Village where Mama Martha and Watoto brothers and sisters welcomed her warmly into their Watoto Home. She is a happy child who loves being with others. Paige will soon begin her education at the Watoto School and she will continue to learn there until she graduates from high school.

On Sundays, Paige goes to the Watoto Church with her family, where she is learning about Jesus' love for her. Please pray for Paige to accept Christ into her heart when she reaches the age of understanding.

Phillip Isabirye: Mar. 7, 2005



Phillip lost his dad to a chronic illness leaving him and his siblings in the care of their mother. His mother stays in a one-roomed house with her seven children. With no income to support the children and living in poor conditions, Watoto was requested to help by providing care to Phillip in the Watoto village. Under the care of Mama, Phillip has grown into a very calm gentleman. He has a passion for fixing things around the house, and currently, he is pursuing a Certificate in Plumbing at Watoto's Hope

Technical Institute. He spends his free time playing soccer and doing voluntary work. Phillip likes to help around his community.

On Sunday, Phillip attends fellowship at the Watoto church. Here he serves as an intercessor. He is part of a small group that meets every Wednesday to nourish themselves with the Word. It is our prayer that Phillip will live a life that glorifies God's name.

Stephen Rubangakene: Dec. 3, 2003



Rebels abducted Stephen's mother from her village in northern Uganda and she gave birth to Stephen in their camp. Later, she managed to escape with her young son and reached the relative safety of a "Displaced Person's Camp," Shortly thereafter Stephen's mother died as a result of HIV/AIDS, leaving him without any guardian to give him proper care. Watoto Child Care Ministries took Stephen into their fold. Stephen was warmly welcomed into the Watoto Village by a loving housemother,

Mama Martha. He has Watoto brothers and sisters in the Watoto Home for companionship. Stephen feels secure and gladly does his share of the household chores. At the Watoto School in the Village, he is receiving a quality education. Stephen's favorite subjects are Literature and English and he enjoys playing soccer in his free time. He hopes to be a truck driver some day.

Stephen attends the Watoto Church with his family on Sundays, and is learning more about Jesus' awesome love for him. Please pray that he will daily grow in the love and knowledge of the Saviour. He is very grateful to the Lord for all his blessings at Watoto.

GriefShare Starting Soon

Healing From Loss is a Journey: Everyone Experiences Grief Differently

A new GriefShare session will begin on Wednesday, August 27th, from 6:30 PM–8:00 PM in room 19. This 13-week grief support group will be led by Pastor Debbie Marion, Minister of Pastoral Care, and focuses on important grief topics associated with the death of a loved one.

Weekly videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a group discussion where confidentiality is key to this program.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing while friends or family members have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people tend to repress their grief and allow fear of what others may think keeping them from what could be helping them. Your bereavement experience may be recent, or not so recent. The hope is that you will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, sibling, other family members, or a friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in your grief and that you do not need to stay there. You will learn valuable information about dealing with the changes in your life and renewing your hope for the future. I hope you will consider being part of this valuable ministry.
