## Mission of the Month Cuba Sister Church

Today, Cuba is in its worst condition in 67 years. Words that are used to describe Cuba are hopelessness, fatigue, exhaustion and despair. Infrastructure that provides electricity, water, trash removal and other services has collapsed. Food insecurity, lack of medicine and all other items compound the misery. In Havana, uncollected trash and garbage is a breeding ground for insects and the disease they carry.

Amid the darkness in Cuba, the church is a light. Doctors do not send patients to the pharmacy or hospital for medicine; the local church is often referenced as a resource. People come to the church and find hope. Baptisms are happening by the thousands in Cuba.

In the past year you have been extremely generous, providing hundreds of pounds of food, medicine and clothing. Friendship Circle provided a solar generator, and a generous couple provided a second solar generator. You have provided funds for a small construction project to further secure the church property. SCCUMC is the church that filled the back of a pickup truck with powdered milk.

This June, during mission of the month we have an opportunity to partner once again with our sister church. We can be the church that helps the church in Cuba bring the light of Christ to the darkness.

The Light changes everything!

### **A message from our sister church pastor:**

*I am Pastor Diosmany Rodríguez Sibadie, and together with my wife, Yusdelkis, we are very grateful to God for your lives. We are thankful for our sister church and Pastor Cynthia, whose generosity has made it possible for our church in San Luis, Santiago de Cuba, to receive many donations during the midst of this economic crisis our country is going through. Our church is very happy and grateful for your generosity. We have been able to distribute milk to children, the elderly, our church members, and others in our community. We have also been able to provide snacks for Sunday School. The joy on the children's faces is clear when they receive a toy, a glass of milk with oatmeal, or clothing from the donations you have sent.*

*Thank you for the lesson materials for the children. Thank you also for the generators. They are a great help to us. There is a great shortage of water, and when it rains, it is a blessing because we are able to collect water for domestic use. The available water is not of good quality, so we are grateful for the water purifier which allows us to drink clean water. We have also been able to help church members and neighbors by sharing this purified water.*

*The medicines you have provided have been extremely helpful, especially considering the difficult conditions in our hospitals. In the midst of these difficult times, the church continues to advance in God's purpose and in faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. We were recently able to celebrate our 28th anniversary. The church is the light and shares its blessings. God bless you. We love you always. Your sister church in San Luis is grateful for your prayers and your support.*



## A Word From Our Senior Pastor - Dr. Cynthia Weems

Thank you, church family, for your prayers as Mark and I traveled to England over the last two weeks. The Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church offers an opportunity for pastors and their spouses to go on a Methodist Heritage Tour as a way of deepening their understanding of our historical and spiritual roots. Our founder, John Wesley, was born in Epworth, England in 1703. His brother, Charles Wesley, the famous hymn writer, was born in 1707. Together, they would begin a movement to bring new life to the church of their birth, the Church of England. This would start with a small group of devoted young men at Oxford University and continue to the port city of Bristol where a significant outreach ministry site began to try and meet the physical and spiritual needs of vulnerable and impoverished people. Later, John and Charles would both move to London where the center of the work continued. John would travel over 250,000 miles on horseback sharing the gospel and Charles would write over 6,500 hymns in their lifetimes. Charles died in 1788 and John in 1791. Methodism would continue to grow in Britain, yet its greatest growth would come in the American colonies and on the American frontier.

There were so many details of the Wesley brothers' lives and the Methodist story that amazed me on the trip. Though I have studied it my whole ministry, the story came to life while visiting their childhood home, standing in the pulpit where John preached and viewing the Bible he read during his devotional time (every day at 5 a.m.!). I know I will be reflecting on the impact of our history for months to come and I am looking forward to teaching a class on our Methodist roots and the historical time period known as the Great Awakening in the fall. For now, I return home with a renewed sense of gratitude for the faithfulness of those who have gone before us. The early Methodists were primarily made up of those who felt distant from God, were forgotten by the established church and were seeking to grow closer to God through building community, worship, Bible study and service to others. I do believe these same practices continue to serve us all in our desire to become more deeply committed Christians. I am excited we are on this journey together!

Being hungry arrives in different ways; from nutrition to loneliness to socialization.

Directors Lori Elder and Eileen Smith, along with about 25 volunteers, each Monday feed our guests in all ways. We want their dining experience to be memorable and enjoyable. Our volunteers receive so much in return from visiting with our guests. Our volunteers have many opportunities to serve, including hot food pick up, greeting each guest upon arrival, serving the meals and desserts, providing drinks and helping in the dishwasher area. Sunday morning room set up at the conclusion of the Contemporary service is a great way to volunteer! We are extremely proud as we recently finished our 1st quarter. We served 622 meals to an average of 55 guests each Monday. We were recently recognized by The Men's Club of Sun City Center and presented with a \$1,000 check to help with our expenses. In our latest church maintenance efforts, we accomplished the following:

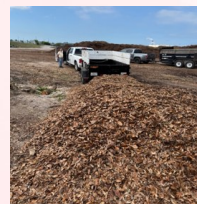
- Raked up 3,500 pounds of leaves
