

### Mission of the Month

#### Florida United Methodist Children's Home

The Florida United Methodist Children's Home was started in 1908 as an orphanage in Enterprise, Florida. Today, it has transformed into a multi-faceted organization with a great deal of breadth and depth. The Children's Home serves children through two residential campuses (Enterprise and Madison), Independent Living services in Enterprise, as well as an emergency shelter in West Palm Beach. Community based services include serving children through our foster care program in four counties around the state. Finally, we serve children and families through outpatient therapeutic counseling in ten counties.

Some organizational highlights include our Equine Therapy program at the Madison Youth Ranch, and our on-campus school at Enterprise, the Legacy Scholars Academy for middle and high school students which was recently named top three in Volusia County reading scores. Our Spiritual Life Team reported that six youth were baptized in 2022, five youth who had no previous experience playing musical instruments took music lessons with our worship coordinator and began playing in our SPARK praise band last year, and 28 of our youth have been involved in leading worship.

In 2022, we served 228 children in our residential and shelter care programs. We served 240 children in Volusia, Flagler, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties through our Foster Care Services. Our Independent Living program provided support to 27 young adults as well as 6 minor children belonging to some of those young adults. Circle of Friends Services provided counseling for 1498 children and families. Our Legacy Scholars Academy had one high school graduate this past year. We are thrilled to announce that we are planning our 2023 Day on Campus on Saturday, March 25th as an in-person event after three years of Covid restrictions. In *Confronting Jesus*, Rebecca McLaughlin shares important biblical context to help all readers see why the Gospels should be taken seriously as historical documents. Exploring eyewitness testimony about Jesus, McLaughlin points to him as a first-century Jewish man who is the Son of God, King of the Jews, mighty healer, greatest teacher, lover of sinners, suffering servant, perfect sacrifice, and universal Lord. This follow-up to her first book, *Confronting Christianity*, helps readers understand the message of the Gospels and explore who Jesus really is.



### See You at the Concert! - Kevin Goodenow



### From the Ledger With Dana Walace

In December we received \$224,588 in income to offset \$185,972 in expenses. This leaves \$38,616 in income over expenses. Our budget anticipated \$222,673 in income or a surplus to budget of \$1,915. Our year-to-date income is \$2,319,191 and our year-to-date expenses are \$2,670,233 which leaves us with \$351,042 in expenses over income this year. We had anticipated in our planning that we would break even for the year.

Our current mortgage balance is \$1,798,404 down from \$1,987,503 on January 1st, a reduction of \$189,099.

It was a very busy and productive year for our missions and ministries, and through several changes to our staff that hopefully were transparent. We continue to serve our communities locally and worldwide with fervor and with your ever-present monetary support and the help of hundreds of dedicated volunteers. Thank you for your stewardship to your ministries this past year and we look forward to your continued support in what we plan to be an even better 2023.
