A Note from Mary Petro:

" ' For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat.... I needed clothes and you clothed me. I was sick and you looked after me....' 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you ... or needing clothes and clothe you. When did we see you sick ... and go visit you?' The King will reply. 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.'"

In the early 2000s, Mary Petro saw a need in the Sun City Center area. Many of her neighbors were living month to month, week to week. even day to day. Sometimes people were forced to choose between buying food and medicine for themselves or for their pets. Mary Petro decided to do something about it!. When she died in 2009 at age 96, she left her estate to establish a fund that would help her former neighbors in Sun City Center and Kings Point who need assistance with food and medicine.

The Mary Petro Food and Medicine Fund generates more than \$100,000 a year that is distributed to those in need who live in Sun City Center or the Kings Point retirement community. The program is administered for the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay by the Sun City Center United Methodist Church.

Times have been tough for everyone lately, but times are even tougher for those who depend on the Mary Petro Fund to get through the week or the month. Now, the benefits only pay for about 90% of what they paid for a few months ago. For many of us, the ten per cent inflation is something we just have to budget for and work around. For those who depend on their Mary Petro Fund payments, it can literally be a matter of life and death.

The Mary Petro Fund needs you. Can you spare a few hours a week? Please become a volunteer. The experience will leave you feeling better about things. FROM THE LEDGER

In March we received \$ 214,416 in income to offset \$ 247,232 in expenses. This leaves \$32,816 in expenses over income. Our year-to-date income is \$648,505 and our year-to-date expenses are \$686,472 which leaves us with \$37,967 in expenses over income this year to date. We would normally have \$1,660 in expenses over income to be covered by our savings. This includes \$18,000 in A/C, AVL, and B&G unanticipated repairs and improvements.

Our current mortgage balance is \$ 1,940,854 down from \$1,987,503 on January 1st.
