MONDAY CLASSES

BEGINNERS CONVERSATIONAL SPANISH LEVEL II (173)

Mondays, 8:30 – 10:00 (6 Classes 10/6 – 11/10) in Room 11	Tuition \$50	Limited to 10
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Students will continue to learn basic vocabulary and verb structure that will enable them to converse on an elementary level. The class will hopefully find a comfort level with the above through dialogue with other class members. Continued practice will be encouraged during the week using handouts, internet resources, and a textbook. Course will use textbook: Carson Dellosa Skills for Success, Spanish Workbook for Middle School and High Schools Students.

The textbook is \$16.00, payable to Center 4Life Learning on October 6th. The textbook may also be purchased in advance at the Center 4Life Learning office.

Hud Richard is a retired Roman Catholic priest who spent 10 years in two inner-city Hispanic parishes in Connecticut (Hartford and New Haven) where he conducted services and some pastoral duties in Spanish. Besides the usual high school and college courses (especially the advanced conversational course at Boston College), he spent two summers in intensive language courses. The first was in Cuernavaca, Mexico where he lived with a Mexican family. (Four students in the class.) The second was Middlebury, Vermont, in their International Language School. He taught Spanish (beginning/advance) for two years in a parish elementary school in Connecticut. He also taught an informal class at Kings Point, Sun City Center at the request of some residents. For three years, Hud has taught beginners and intermediate conversational Spanish classes for the Center 4Life Learning.

The global sightings of UFOs have forced the US government to finally openly admit that UFOs exist and that they're here. Beyond this disclosure the government has remained silent, leaving many questions unanswered. In this course we will be discussing documented UFO case studies, the continuing government coverup, human abductions, implants, animal mutilations and finally alien contact. At the end of the course, you will have a better understanding of this phenomenon and be left with even more unanswered questions.

Traditional art often prioritizes realism and detailed representation, while modern art embraces experimentation, abstraction, and a wider range of materials and concepts. Sometimes difficult to understand, modern art challenges traditional norms and societal values, often reflecting the artist's individual expression and contemporary issues. This course is designed to make the world of modern art more accessible to the viewer.

Bill Ebert retired as a high school teacher specializing in *Twentieth Century U.S. History* and *Holocaust and Genocide* in 2024. Over the course of his career, Bill earned B.A.s in Biology, Chemistry, Education and Art History and a M.A. in American History. Concurrently, he was an adjunct with Camden County College as a professor for The Center for Civic Leadership and Responsibility. In that position, Bill taught wide-ranging social history courses to adults on various topics such as the evolution of graffiti, the relationship of social dance to social movements, man's historical relationship to the food he eats, and others. BEGINNING CALLIGRAPHY (141)

Participants will experience using the ancient dip pen and ink style to draw letters, learn faux calligraphy using various graphite and pens, and finally, modern calligraphy using brush pens. Participants will learn the differences between paper types and experience how to use the correct instruments with the appropriate paper type. 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This three-day course will review and demonstrate the many uses of these devices. Many of these uses depend on Internet resources, so connecting to the Internet, and downloading Apps will be a focus, along with many basic device settings. The course will demonstrate how these devices can help you to: check your email, take and share pictures, transfer your pictures to your computer, read a book, watch a movie, listen to music, and play games. Apps determine what the device can do, so the class will concentrate on basic Apps such as *Google Playstore*, *Email*, *Calendar*, *Photos*, *Camera*, and *Settings*. Apps that expand the use of the device, such as *GoogleDrive*, *Photos*, and *Maps*, will also be discussed and demonstrated. A basic knowledge of your device is expected.

FILM HISTORY OF AMERICAN WAR MOVIES (196)

Fridays, 1:00 – 2:30 p.m. (3 Classes 10/10 - 10/24) in Room 30

War films are a genre of cinema that portray various aspects of warfare, including combat, historical events, the lives of soldiers and the impact of war on individuals and societies. The genre has a long and rich history, evolving alongside technological advancements in filmmaking and changing cultural perspectives on conflict. World Wars I and II significantly shaped the genre, leading to films like *The Battle of Somme* (1916) and *Why We Fight* (1942-1945) used for propaganda and boosting moral. Post-war films began exploring the psychological effects of conflict and questioned the morality of war. Notable films include *All Quiet on the Western Front* (1930) and *The Best of Our Lives* (1946). Film clips and discussion will demonstrate why the American military prevailed in every major conflict.

Thomas Norstrand has, over the last 34 years, cultivated an interest in American Cinema. Tom's uncle, *Bernard Herrman* was one of this country's most famous composers who worked exclusively with prominent directors like *Orson Wells*, *Alfred Hitchcock* and *Martin Scorsese*. Mr. Herrman's films included *Citizen Kane* (1941), *North-By-Northwest* (1959), *Psycho* (1960), and *Taxi Driver* (1978). Thomas holds a master's degree in psychology.

THE CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION OF 1787 (213)

Fridays, 1:00 – 2:30 (3 Classes 10/31 – 11/14) in Room 19

This three-week class includes lectures by instructor Dan Madden, supplemented by Great Courses videos presented by Eric Berger, an authority on U.S. constitutional history, and class discussion.

The topics to be covered include:

- Key European and American thinkers who developed the notion of a “social contract” or “Constitution”
- Early American social contracts and the Articles of Confederation
- Failure of the first national government
- The convention itself. Was it a “revolution”?
- Ratification and the Federalist Papers

Dan Madden is a Freedom Plaza resident and author of two books on the Ancient World, *The Twisty Trail from Homer to Copernicus* and *Avenging Persephone: Alcibiades and the Loss and Restoration of Athenian Democracy*. He earned his PhD in history in 1972 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He has taught classes at Freedom Plaza, Aston Gardens, and Center 4Life Learning.
