Anchor House



Anchor House was founded in 1991 and incorporated in 1993 to address the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of all seafarers arriving at Port Manatee, along with the surrounding SeaPort Manatee Community. As a gospel-centered mission, Anchor House reaches out to serve international seafarers, truckers, and the local community in Port Manatee, Florida. Our motivation stems from the

words of Jesus Christ who commands us to "go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). We take this mission to heart, striving to meet the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of the Port community, regardless of race, gender, country of origin, or religious belief.

We fulfill this mission by providing spiritual and physical nourishment to seafarers and the port community. Our activities include ship visitation, conducting worship services on board vessels, distributing "ditty bags," transporting seafarers to town for supplies, hospital visits, and much more. Our mission is supported through ongoing personal discipleship with local dock workers and online engagement with international seafarers via Zoom and social media, along with personal visits to Port Manatee. Currently, we are sharing the gospel online with seafarers from Russia, India, and the Philippines. Worship services are available upon request onboard ships, and personal "ditty bags" are given to all seafarers, along with land transportation. We also distribute Bibles in over 40 languages, and personal spiritual counseling is available upon request.

We sincerely thank you for your support over the years. Your generosity enables us to continue God's work locally at SeaPort Manatee and internationally among seafarers. We are grateful for a remarkable last year and eagerly anticipate an incredible 2026.


Friends, welcome to Advent! I look forward to walking this Advent journey with you this year.


For us, mission means:

How did it get to be December so soon! This year has certainly been a busy one for our church, and our community. Over these past twelve months, because of your generous contributions to our Mission of the Month recipients, the generosity of your Second Mile Giving, and the generous grants received from The Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, our church has helped not only members but also our community in so many ways.

We have hosted the Mission Smiles Mobile Dental Clinic, offering much needed dental care to those in need. Sertoma Hearing has helped by providing free hearing tests and hearing aids to individuals needing assistance. The BayCare Kids Mobile Medical Bus, along with its dedicated staff, and Preserve Vision delivered vital care for students in our local community as they prepared for the new school year. Thanks to your generous donations of school supplies, we ensured that over 1,200 students were equipped and ready for their first day back. Additionally, BayCare Community Health participated in our Health Clinic, offering free flu vaccines, blood pressure checks, and various tests to support the health of our community.

While that sounds like a lot, there is still more that our church has accomplished this year. Thanks to The Community Foundation of Tampa Bay, we were awarded two grants totaling \$18,000.00. The funding allowed us to provide supplies to Bare Necessities for All which supports individuals, students, families, seniors and our homeless population. Additionally, we have maintained a well-stocked Food Pantry. With your generous contributions through food drives and financial donations, we have successfully kept our Food Pantry operational during the government shutdown that impacted individuals relying on SNAP, EBT, WIC, and other benefits.

We hosted the Professional Learning Community Social Workers, supporting over twenty-five local schools (elementary, middle, and high schools) who assist students and faculty with day-to-day issues. What a wonderful group of individuals who continue to support students through counseling, finding needed resources for them and families, and help ensure homeless students are able to attend school by arranging transportation for them, no matter how transient they are.

On Thanksgiving Day, we served 200 of our closest friends a wonderful Thanksgiving Dinner. This year our team of volunteers cooked love into our Thanksgiving Dinner. A "BIG" Thank You to Gayle Turner, Chuck and Eileen Smith, Bill and Marianne Drake, Mark Sutcliff and Ron Busroe who took on the task. You guys are amazing! I would be remiss is I did not send another "Shout Out" to David and Carries Childs who made sure the kitchen crew and serving happened without a hitch! A heartfelt thank you to all our volunteers who dedicated their Thanksgiving Day to help others. I would name all of you, but my article would be three pages long, LOL!

The Joy of Giving will provide many items to our seniors in local assisted living and memory care facilities who would have not otherwise receive Christmas gifts. Our seniors will be gifted hairbrushes, tissues, fuzzy socks, soft washcloths, nail files, hand lotion, lip balm, clothing, toiletries, lap quilts, crocheted blankets, large print books, puzzle and activity books, coloring books, and so many other truly thoughtful items. I can't wait to see their faces light up with surprise and delight when the gifts are opened— there are even Christmas ducks with a special message attached, thanks to Girl Scout Troop 33319 helping to put them together.

I believe our church is living into our new logo without any problem. Every time I am walking on the church campus or visiting people in our community, our Light is Changing Everything, and I cannot wait until next year when we continue to shine our light in different ways as we continue to be the Hands and Feet of Jesus, making a difference in people's lives every day.



As usual, December is always a very busy month in the concert series program.

We begin the month with the community choral concerts. On Sunday, December 7th at 3:00PM and again on Monday, December 8th at 7:00PM, the Sun City Men's Chorus will be presenting their 2025 Christmas choral concerts. Under the directions of Jeff Jordan, *Home for the Holidays* features traditional holiday favorites like *Sing We Now of Christmas*, *The Little Drummer Boy*, *Blue Christmas*, *A Holly Jolly Christmas*, *Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas* and *I'll Be Home for Christmas* as well as some beautiful and sometimes humorous seasonal songs such as *There Is Faint Music*, *Rise Up Shepherd and Follow*, *Bashana Haba'ah* [in Hebrew], and *You're a Mean One Mr. Grinch* from *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. The concerts also feature two *a cappella* quartets.

Then on Thursday, December 11th at 3:00PM and again on Friday, December 12th at 7:00PM, The Women's Chorus will present their 2025 Christmas choral concerts. Under the direction of Jeff Jordan, this 60-voice ensemble is presenting two concerts entitled *Shalom: Celebrating Peace and Joy.* The concerts include many sacred favorites such as *Gesu Bambino, Carol of the Bells, Do You Hear What I Hear, Mary Did You Know, Joy to the World* as well as some secular classics like *It's Beginning to Look Like Christmas, The Christmas Song, Jingle Bell Rock,* and *Christmas (Baby Please Come Home)*. There's also a new and very clever arrangement called *Jingle Allll the Ways,* a very funny song about *The Twelve Days After Christmas*, and a stunningly beautiful closer entitled *Shalom* by the incomparable Dan Forrest.

On Sunday, December 14th at 3:00PM come hear voices raised in harmony to celebrate Christmas in the barbershop harmony style with the beautiful sounds of the Toast of Tampa Show Chorus and the Heralds of Harmony Barbershop Chorus! Under the direction of Tony DeRosa, the choruses will get you in the holiday spirit as they sing *Sounds of the Season*. The Toast of Tampa Show Chorus is an award-winning barbershop a cappella ensemble of women who perform engaging harmonies in exciting styles. Founded in 1987, Toast of Tampa has performed for audiences around the US and abroad. Consistently placing in the top ten of the Sweet Adelines international chorus competitions, they just won **FIRST PLACE** in the International Sweet Adelines Competition in Columbus, Ohio! Toast of Tampa won its first championship in 1993 and was the 2023 5th Place International Medalist Chorus. Lasting friendships, shared joy and the love of singing excellence are their common bonds.

The Tampa Bay Heralds of Harmony Chorus has been entertaining audiences for over 79 years. The Tampa Chapter is part of the Barbershop Harmony Society and consists of more than 60 men who share in the enjoyment of singing. In the last twenty-six years, the Heralds have achieved national acclaim, winning District contests and placing near the top in international competitions.

Finally on Friday, December 19th, The Cypress Creek Jazz Band will present a new twist to many of your favorite Christmas songs!! The Cypress Creek Jazz Band is a group of local musicians with strong roots in the Tampa music scene. They perform a New Orleans's style jazz, joyful Dixieland jazz, Spiritual Dixieland Hymns and Old-time gospel. This concert will feature their "All That Christmas Jazz" recording project.

They have performed together for over 7 years all over the Tampa area at venues like the Straz Center, Carrollwood Cultural Center, Dade City Kumquat Festival as well as many others.

They also have played at corporate events, festivals, weddings, Madri Gras, and community events. But what keeps this group together is their love for the early jazz music of New Orleans Dixieland.
