We work on a national and local level to provide care and support for all those affected by Alzheimer's and other dementias. The Association is the leading voice for Alzheimer's disease advocacy, fighting for critical Alzheimer's research and care initiatives at the state and federal level.

When we read about the fires that ravaged the historic town of Lahaina, Hawaii, we knew that the loss of life, property and historical treasures was devastating. The lethal combination of hurricane-force winds and parched landscapes resulted in one of the most catastrophic wildfires

the U.S. has ever witnessed. The entirety of Lahaina was consumed, and the surrounding region was impacted. As a result, thousands now grapple with displacement and homelessness, and the fire left a wake of grief due to the loss of life.

I have asked Bishop Escobedo-Frank of the Cal-Pac Annual Conference to determine how we can best assist both immediate and long-term needs. She suggests we give to the Cal-Pac fund, so the money we collect and send will be used for the needs of the community and local United Methodist churches. 

#### Healing From Loss is a Journey: Everyone Experiences Grief Differently

Offering help and encouragement after the death of a spouse, child, family member, or friend, GriefShare is a weekly support group where you'll find a warm, caring environment. There's no "right way" to grieve.

**Feeling angry or full of regret?** Are you depressed and wondering how to heal? Do you walk around in a mental fog? All this is normal. While your grief journey is unique, you'll find many grieving people are facing the same struggles, and others who've gone before you can help.

Grief cannot be rushed. You may wish you could bypass the difficult emotions or push down the pain. Or maybe others are pressuring you to "get up and move on." But healing from grief and loss requires you to go through your grief.

**Finding support is crucial.** Grief is a journey that shouldn't be traveled alone. You may feel like no one understands and be tempted to isolate, but as counselor David Bueno Martin says, "Healing happens in the context of finding others who can help you." A GriefShare group is a safe place to find support.

This program uses biblical concepts for healing from your grief through group discussion, video seminars, and personal workbooks. We will host a 13-week GriefShare program starting Tuesday, September 12th at 5:30PM in Room 30 in the Sanctuary Building. Register by calling 813-634-2539 or emailing *joelle@sccumc.com*. #### From the Ledger

In July we received \$233,966 in income to offset \$180,325 in expenses. This leaves \$53,641 in income higher than expenses. Thankfully, there continues to be no large non-recurring maintenance events. Year to date we received \$1,377,552 versus anticipated receipts of \$1,687,087 or a shortfall to the budget of \$309,535. The total income last July was \$1,418,169, \$40,167 higher than this year.

Overall, our year-to-date operating shortfall is \$137,475. We anticipated in our planning that we would break even for the year.

Many thanks and blessings to those of you who are able and have stepped up their giving. However, as you can see from the above operating results, we are still operating at a deficit and continuing to diminish our meager savings.

Our current Mortgage Balance is \$1,690,344.10.

We thank you for your continued financial support of your church. Together, we will continue to spread the good news of Jesus Christ through our service to the communities that surround us and beyond.

FIRST AND FOREMOST... BREAKAWAY, WAS ONE OF LAST MONTH'S "MISSIONS OF THE MONTH," THANKS YOU FOR YOUR GENEROUS SUPPORT. YOU MAKE BREAKAWAY HAPPEN.

Tisdale is Renee's last name, and she is the director of our church's Breakaway Respite Ministry. This newsletter is about her (even though she fiercely protested) and the new adventures that are occurring in Breakaway.

Renee is a hugger, and it doesn't matter if you are a long-time friend or are being introduced for the first time. Accompanying that hug will be laughter. Renee seems to always be laughing, but don't think that she is never serious or sincere. Renee is very serious about seeing that those with dementia who come to Breakaway and their caregivers get the best possible love and care.

Renee uses two arms to give a hug, but she has two more. She needs four arms to juggle all the balls in the air at Breakaway: volunteers, those with Dementia, caregivers, and programing. As with all volunteer efforts and ministries, these elements are always in a state of flux with last-minute, on-the-run decision making. Renee is a master juggler.

Renee is a fire ball. She is in constant motion. She is the spark that ignites Breakaway and it's her energy that moves Breakaway forward. Renee is fun, funny and a bit Kooki-Crazy at times. Behind all that explosion is a big and caring heart. She cries when our friends have to leave us. She cries over the hardship of our volunteers and caregivers — we are one big family. I've seen her fail to choke back tears while she was watching a volunteer slow dancing with a friend (a person with dementia).

The soft side of Renee is balanced by her assertiveness. She asserts herself when she sees that friends are not receiving the care they deserve. As she will tell us, a friend is never to be left alone at a table. There will be no gossip. She will hoot and holler to say "thank you" to people who come to entertain us. Don't sit and chat with our friends; engage them. Friends come first. Friends are not patients or clients. They are friends. Schafer, play safer at the Tunnel of Love!

So, what's with the Tacos and Tattoos alteration? I did mention the Kooki-Crazy side of Renee. Tattoos for old people????? We volunteers and friends are all.... OLD! Yep! So, Renee orders fake tattoos for everyone!

Some of us volunteers were a little skeptical — What will our friends think? What will the caretakers think? Will the tattoos make a mess and come off easily? Worry. Worry. Renee charges ahead by inviting the caretakers (and church staff) to join us on the wild side as we became a rowdy bunch of painted people ... laughing people .... To fulfill the alteration, Renee gets Joe, the church's chef, to ditch his planned meal, and put together a taco lunch, which everyone enjoyed. (More taco lunches please!!!) By the way, Jeff, Pastor Josh, Pastor Debbie, Bill, Aisling and Teodora, all staff members, left smiling and proudly showing their tats.

A new venture for Breakaway is creating and selling items made by Breakaway volunteers and friends. Our first adventure involved having our friends drop different colored alcohol inks on paper and tiles. The images are beautiful. From these creations we have sold and continue to sell greeting cards (available at the Pages of Life Bookstore in the LEC Lobby) and decorative tiles and coasters. 



We had volunteers from the Rotary, Kiwanis, and Lions Clubs, Community Foundation of Tampa Bay South Shore, the Kings Point Pickleball Club, Valencia Lakes, HCA South Shore Hospital, BayCare, St Joseph's Hospital South, Calvary, Prince of Peace, Beth Israel Jewish Congregation, St Andrew Presbyterian, UMCSCC, Girls of the World, Girl Scouts, God's Dogs, Interfaith Social Action Council of SCC, hair stylists, Kings Point Sportsman Club, and so many more who were willing to give of their time to help us get everyone ready for school. I would be remiss if I did not also mention Jack's Shack, Replay's Family Sports Grill, Community Foundation of Tampa Bay South Shore, South Hillsborough and South Shore Chambers of Commerce, CC's Café, Southshore Falls, Renaissance Spa and Fitness Center, HCA South Shore Hospital, Freedom Plaza, Sun Towers, Kings Point, Angel's Attic, Calvary, Prince of Peace, Beth Israel Jewish Congregation, St Andrews Presbyterian Churches, and many, many more locations who collected school supplies for us.

At the end of the day, we served over 200 families, some of which had 3 or more (up to 9 children) get ready for school, with supplies, new shoes, Bombas Socks, backpacks, lunch boxes, pantry food, etc. The remainder of the school supplies were distributed to Sumner High, Shields Middle, Cypress Creek, Reddick, Ruskin, Thompson, and Wimauma Elementary Schools in addition to the Boys and Girls Club. We are already starting to plan our 2nd Annual Community Back-to-School Fair for next year and several who partnered with us this year have signed up again! What a Blessing!!
