Some of us have spent years together and now our friends require more than we and their caregivers can provide and when they move into a memory care facility, we grieve.

Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; He has risen! [Luke 24:5 NIV].

These are the words spoken by the angels at the empty tomb on Easter Sunday which, this year, comes VERY early, on March 31st – something that makes us Worship Arts folks work a little harder and a little faster. So why does this date change each year, e.g., in 2022 it was almost three weeks later! *Easter occurs on the Sunday after the first full moon following the vernal equinox, which welcomes spring in the northern hemisphere*. Now, I'm not so sure that helps folks like me that are a little 'science-challenged', but that is how it the holiday is determined.

So, let's look ahead at the busy and beautiful month of Lent & Easter!

During the second and third weeks of the month, two of the community choral ensembles that make their home here and under my direction, are performing a series of concerts as follows (all concerts are \$10 donation at the door and include many of our choristers):

The entire work is based on African American spirituals that are VERY powerful. Once again, the Choir will be joined by a string ensemble (from TFO), our favorite percussionists AND our favorite organist/pianist! There will NOT be a performance on Saturday, March 23rd as in the past, but we will be presenting the work on Sunday, March 24th at both traditional services.

After that, I want to encourage you to attend ALL Holy Week services, that is Maundy (or Holy) Thursday, March 28th at 7PM and Good Friday, March 29th at 7PM as well. The first of these will be focused on **foot-washing**, something Jesus did for His disciples before the Last Supper, and the second of these will culminate with Pastor Charlie's amazing *Service of the Shadows*. Easter Sunday services will be four in number, as usual, and as follows:

Sunrise (in the parking lot back behind the Choir room) at 6:30AM **Traditional** at 8:30AM & 11AM **Contemporary** at 9:45

February 2024 has been a victorious month for Mary Petro Food and Medicine Fund.

On Saturday, February 3, 2024, Mission Smiles and Mobile Dental Clinic provided another successful dental mission on our campus. Special thanks to all the volunteer Dentists, Hygienists, HCC dental hygiene students, Coordinators and UMC Volunteers. The services provided were as follows: 11 Extractions, 13 Filings and 11 Dental Cleanings. The dollar value of dental services donated to this community was \$10,345.00 and the dollar value of volunteers served was \$5,430.72. Total \$15,775.72. Sertoma Speech and Hearing Foundation of Florida also provided another successful Hearing Clinic this day, and provided 18 Hearing tests to those in need in our community.

On Monday, February 5, 2024, Mary Petro Food and Medicine Fund was invited to SouthShore Philanthropy Fair, which was hosted by Miles and Barbara Capron and Bob and Rebecca Mohr, on behalf of Community Foundation Tampa Bay. Each of the fifteen non profit organizations attending this event (which included our Breakaway Ministry) was awarded a \$2,500.00 donation. Mary Petro Food and Medicine Fund won the drawing for a \$15,000.00 prize given by Community Foundation of Tampa Bay. UMCSCC was awarded a total of \$20,000.00 at this event!




