### **MISSION OF THE MONTH**

### Residing Hope

We are deeply humbled and honored that you chose Residing Hope as your Mission of the Month for July. Residing Hope? Yes, Residing Hope. After several years of effort and consideration we re-branded on March 16, 2024 to a new name which we hope more fully conveys exactly who we are and all we do.

Residing Hope, formerly known as The Florida United Methodist Children's Home was started in 1908 as an orphanage in Enterprise, Florida. Today, it has transformed into a multi-faceted organization with a great deal of breadth and depth. Residing Hope serves children through two residential campuses (Enterprise and Madison), and Independent Living services in Enterprise. Community based services include serving children through our foster care program in four counties around the state and community children through our Montessori School in Enterprise. Finally, we serve children and families through outpatient therapeutic counseling in ten counties.

Some organizational highlights include our Equine Therapy program at the Madison Youth Ranch which time after time continues to impact young lives and enables them to eventually open up to their counselors and others. This form of therapy has consistently led to transformed lives, confessions of faith to Christ and baptisms signifying new life! Our Spiritual Life Team on our Enterprise campus reports that seven youth made decisions to step out in faith and were baptized in 2023. We had three youth start taking weekly piano lessons and they performed in their first recital while several of our other youth worked together and wrote three original songs we now use in worship on Sundays!

In 2023, we served 155 children in our residential care programs. We served 166 children in Volusia, Flagler, Broward and Palm Beach Counties through our Foster Care Services. Of those children, 27 were re-unified with their families and 18 found their forever families! Our Independent Living program provided support to 13 young adults, two of whom graduated from high school and began college. In addition, three of them were able to buy new cars! Our Outpatient Counseling Services provided counseling for 1234 children and their families. For more success stories please check out our website at www.residinghope.org.


### **'Happenings' with Children & Youth**


Here are a few reminders as I close this note to all of you:

#### A QUESTION OF FAITH:



### From the Ledger - Bill Turner

Greetings church family!!

In May, we received \$160,986 in income to offset \$236,203 in expenses. This leaves us with **\$75,217** in expenses over income. Our income year-to-date is \$968,490 and our expenses year-to-date are \$1,097,098. This leaves us with **\$128,608** in expenses over income through May.

Our current mortgage balance is \$1,557,535 as of June 1st, 2024.

Please reflect on your stewardship decisions and their impact on the future of our church. Every member plays a crucial role in maintaining the financial well-being of our community, and your participation is vital for our shared success.
