Anchor House



Anchor House is a maritime ministry located right inside SeaPort Manatee. We have been serving international seafarers, local dockworkers, and port staff since 1993. Every day, ships from around the world dock just a few hundred yards from our front door. The international crews who arrive have often been away from home for months, exhausted, isolated, and thousands of miles from their families. We believe that everyone whose lives we touch deserves to be seen, valued, and cared for, especially the men and women who spend

months at sea to keep our global economy moving.

Each year, Anchor House reaches more than 10,000 seafarers from more than 70 nations. In addition to serving seafarers, we also care for the local dockworkers and port staff who keep the port running day in and day out 24/7. Our center is open weekdays as a safe, welcoming place for meals, fellowship, and connection.

Our mission is simple: to meet the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of international seafarers and the SeaPort Manatee community.

We do that in very practical ways, through hospitality, transportation, free Wi-Fi so crew members can connect with loved ones back home, worship services, and one-on-one care. Sometimes that looks like a ride to the store, sometimes a quiet place to rest, and sometimes just a listening ear.

As we near the end of summer, Anchor House is preparing for a very busy fall and winter. As the year progresses, we look forward to many events Anchor House will host, and I hope you will consider joining us. On September 18, we will co-host our third annual Clay Shoot at Fish Hawk Sporting Clays. At the time of writing, we have over 25 teams signed up, totaling approximately 100+ participants. On October 3, we will host our annual Golf Outing at the River Club. You can sign up on our website www.anchorhousemission.com/golf. Dear Friends,

This month we are beginning a new sermon series on the life of David. The recounting of the life of King David is found from 1 Samuel 16 to the end of 2 Samuel as well as the book of 1 Chronicles (that is A LOT of biblical material). We will be reading a good portion of this through the month of September. David is a significant figure in the Old Testament and in our understanding of Jesus, “Son of David.” Jesus is born into the lineage of David, generations later.

David is both an inspiring and problematic leader. Pastor Travis and I will attempt to highlight both sides of David’s life. In many ways, David is a leader we can relate to. He is called to important things and makes many wise and good decisions. He also makes poor decisions when left unchecked. *What can we learn from David’s life?*

The four themes of his life that we will focus on in this series, titled, *The Heart of a King* will be endurance, covenant, integrity and legacy. During this series, we are also going to do some things differently in worship. We will add a *psalter* to both traditional and contemporary worship services during the month of September. David is known to have written many of the psalms and we want to lift them up during the month. This will require us to remove some other items from worship during this month. Our hope is to amplify and expand the many ways we are able to worship God. Thank you, in advance, for your openness to new things.

Becoming a Debt-Free Church Each Gift Spreads the **Light**.

As announced in worship on August 2, we are now debt-free! Your incredible faithfulness to our Debt-Free campaign made this possible. Here are the numbers:

Total pledges = **\$1,435,971.13**

Total given as of 8/15 = \$1,053,154.13

Total remaining pledges = \$382,817*

**Thank you for continuing to pay your pledge until it is fulfilled.*

As a reminder, our church budget was also contributing its monthly mortgage payment toward the debt which partnered with the campaign to make possible the VERY early payoff of the mortgage. This means more money for the **Future Building Improvement Fund** which will house all remaining funds from the campaign. This fund already has \$150,000.00. Your good stewardship will make possible a tremendous number of projects around our church buildings and grounds (see message from the Board of Trustees).

Please plan to join us for a **Mortgage Burning Party** on **Sunday, September 27, 2026** from 12 noon – 1:30 p.m. The actual mortgage burning will take place at 12:45 under the LEC portico. Our praise band, *Broken Together*, will perform and hot dogs will be served.

A Message from the Board of Trustees

Just a few months ago, our church embarked on a campaign with two important goals: to retire our mortgage and to dedicate any surplus pledges toward future building improvements. Through God's faithfulness and the extraordinary generosity of our congregation, we not only achieved our goal of paying off the church mortgage but also received an additional **\$435,000** in pledged support for much needed capital improvements to our facilities. This remarkable response reflects our congregation's commitment to preserving and enhancing our church home for current and future generations. Over the coming months, the Board of Trustees will begin sharing details about projects made possible through your generosity starting with lighting upgrades, new signage and refreshing our welcome spaces in the Narthex, LEC Lobby, Church Office and Creason Hall. These improvements are designed to make our church brighter and more inviting for everyone who enters our doors—whether they are longtime members, first-time guests, or members of our community attending one of our many ministries and events. Thank you for your generous pledges and your faithful stewardship. You have truly continued to make an IMPACT here where **the Light changes everything!**

GRIEF SHARE®

Wednesday Evenings Beginning September 16

Healing from loss is a journey:
Everyone experiences grief differently.

A new Grief Share session will begin on Wednesday, September 16th, from 6:00 PM – 7:30 PM in Room 19. This 13-week grief support group, ending December 9, will be led by Pastor Debbie Marion, Minister of Congregational Care, and focuses on important grief topics associated with the death of a loved one.

Weekly videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by our group discussion, where confidentiality is key to the success of this program.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing while friends or family members have returned to their daily routines. Too often people tend to repress their grief and allow fear of what others may think keep them from what could be helping them. Your bereavement experience may be recent, or not so recent. The hope is that you will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, sibling, other family members, or a friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in your grief and that you do not need to stay there. You will learn valuable information about dealing with the changes in your life and renewing your hope for the future.

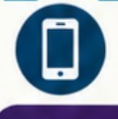

For those of you who love "classical" chamber music, there's a piano & trumpet recital on Sunday, September 20 at 3pm. Dr. Andreea Mut, piano, and Dr. Justin Langham, trumpet, will be performing a program entitled ***Songs of Travel*** that will include works by Bach, Piazzolla, De Falla, Debussy, Irving Berlin, Jobim, and others. We don't often get the opportunity to hear this kind of music in our 'neck of the woods', so don't miss it!

We begin our morning as a group with devotion to God and Country. Then we move on to whatever activity is planned for the day, whether it be arts and crafts, brain games, physical exercise, all of the above, or something else altogether! We had a great time recently celebrating National Watermelon Day! We made watermelon fans, which we used to cool ourselves in this hot weather, and enjoyed eating delicious watermelon.

Our group activities tend to finish just before we enjoy a family-style lunch together. *Did you know that we someone to prepare lunch for us every Wednesday? Do you like to cook for crowds? We can do the shopping or you, if you prefer, you'll keep your receipts to be reimbursed. Please let me know if this is something you're interested in.*

We love to reuse and repurpose at Breakaway. We created some awesome bird artwork with repurposed buttons one day, and our bulletin board is filled with flowers created from the packing paper that arrive with all deliveries! Thanks to one of our amazing volunteers, we'll soon be creating adorable flowers from cardboard egg cartons!

We recently created door/wall hangings using construction materials! Who knew that wooden biscuits could be turned into beautiful flowers? And since fall is almost here, we're going to be making cute shelf-sitting pumpkins! The wall hangings that didn't go home with their creators are adorning the closets here in Creason. Some projects have been so successful that we do them repeatedly. Some of the items for sale in Breakaway Creations, for example, are things we make a few times per year.

Service projects are also a favorite activity. Just because our friends are living with dementia doesn't mean they don't still want to serve. A few of our projects have included filling Easter eggs, bagging up pet food, decorating bags, and putting meal-in-a-bag kits together for other church ministries. We will also be putting flowers together again for the upcoming Walk to End Alzheimer's.

I've been with Breakaway since 2019 and can only remember not playing volleyball after lunch once! Playing seated balloon volleyball gets us ready for dessert, which is often delightful homemade confections created by our amazing volunteers! Our days always end with music. We are blessed to have so many awesome musicians come and perform for us. If we don't have live music, one way to get us singing or up dancing is playing Wheel of Fortune where all the puzzles are song titles. Our friends might be struggling to carry on a conversation, but when the right song comes on, they're singing!

In the coming weeks, we're looking forward to racing cars that we painted and enjoying the end of summer with a beach-themed day. We'll soon be traveling back to the 1900s—the '60s and '70s, to be specific! Our '50s sock hop was such a hit that we might as well carry on through the decades, right? And there's much more to come!
