I would like to express my gratitude to all those who signed up and participated in the Salvation Army Tampa Command's bell-ringing campaign at Publix. Despite facing

inclement weather and colder temperatures, everyone persevered and contributed to raising funds for individuals in dire need.

Our bell-ringing began on November 25th and continued from Monday through Saturday, 10am to 6pm, for 25 days straight. We had a total of 79 workers who put in a collective 102 hours, with 18 individuals working more than once.

UPDATE: From the Disaster Response Team (DRT)

The DRT wishes to extend their gratitude and blessings to the congregation for their generous support through the Mission of the Month and throughout the year. In 2023, the team also received support through their recycle program, as 2440 pounds of aluminum cans (equivalent to approximately 80,000 cans) and 24,180 pounds of scrap metal (including 61 water heaters and other appliances) were collected, raising around \$3600. The prices of recycled materials are subject to yearly fluctuations. Special thanks to Earl Gall for overseeing this effort.

The DRT also engaged in several day trips to Ellenton to offer assistance to a couple who suffered damage to their mobile home from a storm. The project required the demolition, insulation, paneling, drywalling, and painting of the couple's home. The couple expressed their appreciation to the church for providing this assistance.

The DRT is hosting an Equipment Maintenance Manager training session on March 18, 2024, following the monthly DRT meeting.

If you're in need of some assistance with minor home projects, you'll be happy to know that 'His Helpers' are available to help! Simply head to the church office and sign up for their assistance. The process is easy and straightforward. Once you've submitted your request, a member of the team will be in touch to schedule a time that works for you. At our church, we believe that faithfully serving God leads to blessings for our community and its ministries. We view tithing and offerings as an act of worship, obedience, celebration, and thanksgiving to the Lord. We're pleased to announce that in December, we received \$259,947, offset by \$149,171 in expenses. This leaves us with \$110,777 in income over expenses. Our year-to-date income is \$2,228,652, and our year-to-date expenses are \$2,493,306, resulting in a \$264,654 deficit through December.

We're also proud to announce that our mortgage balance is down to \$1,622,187 from \$1,814,706 as of January 1st, 2023.

Vivacious Ministries with Victoria Sorensen

While we are already into the month of February of the New Year, I want to take a moment to share with you what our church ministries and our community accomplished in 2023. As you know, we hosted events and activities that allowed us to connect with our community and bring people to our church campus to experience the love of Christ.

Events such as our Community Back-to-School Fair, FALLtoberfest, the Community Thanksgiving Dinner, Madrigal Dinner, Sights and Sounds, Friday Night at the Movies, and our wonderful Concert Series, allowed us to not only serve our community but also provide a sense of belonging to a family.

I was so fortunate to connect with many community organizations, this past year, which some of you are members of, to help us take care of children, youth, young adults, families, and our senior population. As you know, it "takes a village" to take care of others and make a significant difference whether it is through your time, your talents, or your generous donations, every aspect of giving is critically important to "make a difference" in our community.

Listed below are a few of our behind-the-scenes accomplishments that changed lives in our community because of your contributions and the contributions of our community organizations:

- The Back-to-School Fair collected and provided backpacks, school supplies, socks, shoes, and pantry items to over two hundred families.
- The church fed over five hundred people, including the homeless, during our Thanksgiving Dinner .
- Monetary donations enabled us to purchase twenty-seven turkeys for Thanksgiving dinners for underserved families at the Lord's Lighthouse in Wimauma.
- Individual members of the congregation donated books, toys, bedding, a sleeping bag, and hygiene items to help the local children and youth.
- Athletic clothing and underwear donated through our Angel Tree were distributed by church members to children and youth who attend seven schools in our community.
- Community members purchased Christmas gifts for seventy-five children at Thompson Elementary School who would not have received any otherwise.
- Community and congregational donations enabled us to purchase Christmas gifts, pantry food, pizza and cupcakes, and Christmas stockings for a Christmas Party which served over two hundred children and their families.
- Monetary donations totaling over \$800.00 purchased gift cards and food for several families including a family of seven and a family who has members in Hospice care.
- Teachers received gift baskets from our Friendship Circle to provide a pick-me-up for all they do for the children and youth in our schools.

As you can see, we served so many families, children, youth, and seniors in our community last year. By my rough estimate, over 1,000 families were provided for through your generosity, and the generosity of our community partners, whether it was through your monetary donations or your time.

I would be remiss if I did not mention a few of our community donors that helped with all these wonderful things last year. A special "Thank You" to The Michigan Club, Kings Point Pickle Ball Club, The Masonic Park and Youth Camp, and Gannon University for their contributions. In addition, I would like to thank the Friendship Circle, and all the members of our church family who made a difference not only to our church family but also those in our community.

In 2024, we will continue to do God's work in the community as well as in our church family, but we need your help to continue our wonderful work.
