### Meet Our New Pastor!! Rev. Travis Taylor



Hello Sun City Center!

I can't tell you how excited I am to finally be here and serving alongside you! In July you were all so warm and made my family and me feel so welcome that we all feel blessed to be here and are looking forward to whatever August brings.

#### How God Led Me to Florida

I went through Candidacy in the Fall of 2017. If you don't know, candidacy is the process by which the United Methodist Church uses to discern someone's heart and aptitude for vocational ministry. It's the process Jeff Jordan began this past Spring and was approved to continue at our most recent Annual Conference.

For me, it was a really good experience. Even though I had been employed in some form of vocational church ministry since 2006, my licensing journey introduced me to our broader

denomination and challenged me in fresh ways.

Not long after beginning this journey, one of my mentors, Jim, took me out to lunch. Jim was a second-generation Methodist pastor who, at 76 years old, had recently retired as an elder in the UMC. Over big slices of pizza we talked about the ups and downs of pastoral ministry and about all the positive and negative aspects of being connected to such a large denomination as the UMC. I'll never forget one of the most profound statements he shared with me that day. Almost sadly, he said, "Travis, I feel like I spent the bulk of my ministry beating myself bloody against doors that were closed to me. Maybe I should have just gone through the doors God *opened*..."

For me, Jim's words were such a profound piece of wisdom, and since then, they have influenced my life and pastoral decisions in so many ways. The constant realization that *God* is the Way Maker, not me, has since brought me peace and provided for me a spiritual safety-net that undergirds all my ministerial ambitions.

So in 2021, when Sarah and I became restless for something different and started praying for guidance and discernment for what God might be calling us to next, *my* prayer and promise to God was this: "Lord, I love You and I trust You. I'm going to knock on some new doors, and if those doors do not open, I promise I will not be bitter, nor will I beat myself bloody, pounding my fists against doors You have not opened. *But* if I knock and a door opens, then let that be *Your* sign to me that *You* are guiding my steps and give me the courage to walk through and go wherever that door leads."

And in May of 2022, God in His providence opened a door for us to relocate from Indiana to Florida and for me to accept a position as Assist. Pastor at Christ UMC in St. Pete. It was a big move for everyone, but we trusted God and He has been faithful through every step. And now, God has opened another door!

I am so excited for this chapter of ministry with all of you and cannot wait to discover what doors God will open for us this time!

Greetings church family!!

In June, we received \$139,017 in income to offset \$195,514 in expenses. This leaves us with **\$56,497** in expenses over income. Our income year-to-date is \$986,710 and our expenses year-to-date are \$1,199,982. This leaves us with **\$213,272** in expenses over income through June.

Our current mortgage balance is \$1,544,188 as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024.


