We are truly humbled and honored that you have selected Residing Hope as your Mission of the Month for February. Residing Hope? Yes, that's right! After years of thoughtful consideration, we rebranded on March 16, 2024, to a name that we believe better reflects who we are and all that we do.

Founded in 1908 as an orphanage in Enterprise, Florida, Residing Hope, previously known as The Florida United Methodist Children's Home, has evolved into a multifaceted organization with significant depth and breadth. We support children through two residential campuses (Enterprise and Madison) and provide Independent Living services in Enterprise. Our community-based services include a foster care program that serves children across four counties and a Montessori School in Enterprise. Additionally, we offer outpatient therapeutic counseling to children and families in ten counties.

Some highlights of our organization include our Equine Therapy program at the Madison Youth Ranch, which consistently makes a profound impact on young lives, encouraging them to open up to their counselors and others. This form of therapy has led to numerous transformed lives, confessions of faith in Christ, and baptisms symbolizing new beginnings! Our Spiritual Life Team on the Enterprise campus celebrates youths that made the brave decision to step out in faith and were baptized this past year. Furthermore, some of our youths began weekly piano lessons and performed in their first recital, while several others collaborated to write three original songs that we now incorporate into our Sunday worship!

We could not accomplish anything without your inspiring partnership with us. The continuing consistent support of the local church is the backbone of our ministry. Thank you!

A Word From Our Pastor

Dear Friends.

The new year has begun with great enthusiasm. During the month of January we shared in Holy Communion, reaffirmed our baptisms and consecrated our church leaders for the year. It feels good to "begin the year right" with a refocusing of our attention to the most central components of our faith and life together.

Another event happened in January that feels, to me, like another example of refocusing our attention on a central component to our faith. On Friday, January 17, our church sponsored an event at a community clubhouse just a few minutes north of the church. The idea was to invite 6th-12th grade youth to the clubhouse (in their neighborhood) for food and games. We wanted to get to know these young people and their families and felt this might be a good way to do it. Door hangers inviting them to the event were placed on hundreds of doors the week prior and an invitation was placed on the community's social media page. On that evening, over 60 young people came to the event. We played games, ate, met several parents and young adult siblings. The event was a big success. I want to thank our Director of Next Gen Ministries, Faniel Pradel, and Pastor Travis Taylor for organizing the event and making it happen.

Now, you might ask why this is an event that "refocuses our attention on a central component of our faith?" The answer is in the life and ministry of Jesus. With Jesus we find a savior who goes where the people are. Jesus did not wait for people to come to him (though they often did!). Jesus went to the people to hear from them, learn from them and offer them healing, teaching and salvation. We, too, want to move about in our community so that the love and hope of Jesus will be known in greater ways as we get to know our community – hearing from them, learning from them and offering the transforming power of relationship with Jesus.

It is a great honor to be your pastor and I am looking forward a fantastic year ahead!

The United Methodist Church of Sun City Center is deeply committed to the Meals on Wheels program. Throughout the month of April, we will be delivering meals to those who have signed up for the service in Kings Point and Sun City Center. Meal packages can be picked up at South Bay Hospital between 3:00pm and 3:15pm, and will be delivered to designated locations according to a route slip. Each route takes approximately one hour to complete. Deliveries are made seven days a week, and two sets of drivers are required from Monday to Friday, while one set is sufficient for both KP and SCC on weekends.

We need 12 drivers full-time and 7 backup for Sun City Center and Kings Points. That's a total of 24 full-time drivers and 14 backup!

Recycling has had a very good 2024 with totals above 2023! Total funds collected were \$6160. This included 2600 pounds of aluminum cans and 26,000 pounds of scrap metal. Debris clean-up for 2024 included 4210 pounds of tree trimmings; 12,540 pounds of leaves and debris from church property; and 308 cubic yards of mulch was distributed on church property.

February is Black History Month, a time when we pay tribute to the generations of African Americans who struggled with adversity to achieve full citizenship in American society. Carter G. Woodson, like W. E. B. Du Bois before him, believed that truth could not be denied, and that reason would eventually prevail over prejudice. His hopes to raise awareness of African American's contributions to civilization was realized when he and the organization he founded, the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), conceived and announced Negro History Week in 1925. The event was first celebrated during a week in February 1926 that encompassed the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. The response was overwhelming. By the time of Woodson's death in 1950, Negro History Week had become a central part of African American life and substantial progress had been made in bringing more Americans to appreciate the celebration. The Black Awakening of the 1960s dramatically expanded the consciousness of African Americans about the importance of black history, and the Civil Rights movement focused Americans of all colors on the contributions of African Americans to our history and culture. The celebration was expanded to a month in 1976, the nation's bicentennial. President Gerald R. Ford urged Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history." Since then, each American president has issued Black History Month proclamations. And the association—now the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH)—continues to promote the study of Black history all year. (Excerpted from an essay by Daryl Michael Scott, Howard University, for the Association for the Study of African American Life and History)

So, how are we celebrating Black History Month at our church, you might ask? Well, I encourage you to listen carefully to the music you'll be hearing from the Chancel Choir, the handbell ensembles, a trio, and the soloists during the month of February. The Chancel Choir will be singing Glenn Burleigh's powerful Order My Steps, arrangements of great old spirituals like This Little Light of Mine and Precious Lord, Take My Hand as well as an a cappella arrangement of My God Is So High by the late, great Moses Hogan. Our handbell ensembles will be sharing arrangements of spirituals like Didn't My Lord Deliver Daniel? and I'm Just a Poor Wayfaring Stranger. Finally, Y'ALL will be singing many of the wonderful African American spirituals found in our hymnal including There Is a Balm in Gilead, Swing Low Sweet Chariot, and Lord I Want to Be a Christian along with several others. I encourage you to do some research about this special time in the calendar. As United Methodists, we are called to learn about and to embrace other cultures. Understanding others gives us license, nay, compels us to do what Jesus taught us to do – love others as ourselves!

Finally, and once again, I love this church and this family of faith. Thank you for your never-ending love and heartfelt encouragement!


