

Mission of the Month Miracle Ministries (Our Sister Church in India)

Greetings from Miracle Ministries!

At the very outset I would like to thank you so much for having selected us as 2023 Sun City Center United Methodist Church Mission of the Month for November.

Let me give you a brief introduction of the Ministries. Miracle Ministries is a multifaceted organization with its headquarters in Kadali, on the southeast coast of India. Below are our Ministries that you help support.



Miracle Church: Miracle Ministries runs a Miracle Church which has 300 congregation in attendance.

Miracle Children's Home: 42% of our population falls below the poverty line making \$1.25 a day! 6000 children under the

age of 6 die of hunger and malnutrition. The Miracle Children's home was started in 2001 to be a beacon of hope to children who are being deprived of their childhood. Currently we are catering to the needs of 20 children.



Living Waters: Partnered with Global Water Consortium, Miracle Ministries is providing good drinking water to the community.

PNG Institute: Miracle Ministries is providing computer education to the young people through the PNG computer Institute.

Dorca's Sewing Institute: Miracle Ministries is serving the women through Dorca's sewing school.



Church Construction: Miracle Ministries is involved in church construction. So far we have constructed four churches with the help of Sun City Center UMC.


